Well it has seemed like years since I have heard from you, but being out on the high seas there is very little chance of getting any for some time, but I know you are writing.

Now that our mail is being censored we will have to be very careful.

I haven't been sea-sick as yet and don't expect to either. With all my experience I shouldn't.

As you understand I can't write what I want to any more as you know, but someday when it is all over I can relate all of what will be a question in your minds now.

There are a few things I would like you to get for me and that is this year's Year book from School. Don't send it to me but keep it so when I get home.



There is one thing I forgot to
tell you and that is I made out
an allotment @ \$15 every month
you will receive \$15 a month.

You see I get 20% more money
a month more for overseas
duty. It starts with the month
of March and you will receive
it after March's pay is issued.

I saw "Marty" that Sunday
night after I saw you called
you for the last time and
we went to the Service Club
for our last fling for the
short time we had.

I can't think of much
more to write about than
I have mentioned already
so will close for the present.
